Emerging Nurse Researcher Award

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Honor Society of Nursing, Sigma Theta Tau International's (STTI's) Emerging Nurse Researcher Award is to recognize an early-career nurse researcher from each of the global regions whose research has influenced the profession and the people it serves. <u>STTI membership is required.</u>

ELIGIBILITY

All active STTI members worldwide are eligible to be nominated for this award. Members may not self-nominate; any self-nominations will be disqualified. STTI current elected board and committee members, STTI staff, STTI consultants and contracted staff, and members of the judging committee are not eligible.

CRITERIA

- 1. Completed and earned a doctorate after December 2012
- 2. Demonstrated that research has had an impact in a country or global region on the profession, patients, families, community, or policy
- Demonstrated a record of disseminating research results in professional nursing and/or non-nursing publications and oral and/or poster presentations
- Received external funding, university funding, or unique organizational support with justified unique context of funding as Principal Investigator (PI) or Co-PI
- Recognized as an early-career investigator and emerging leader whose work is influencing practice, education, administration, research, and/or utilization of evidence

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Supporting documents required below must address the criteria. Entries that do not meet the criteria and requirements below will be disqualified. A complete online nomination consists of:

- Online entry form and payment
- Supporting narrative, from the nominator: Using the five criteria as subheadings, clearly describe area of emerging interest and scope (no more than 500 words with subheadings)
- Three letters of support from diverse sources supporting the criteria (interprofessional colleague, supervisor, coworker, etc. – excluding nominator)
- Nominee's curriculum vitae, plus a listing of three to five publications that showcases the criteria, including nursing and nonnursing peer-reviewed publications
- Letter of Acceptance Statement from the nominee agreeing to attend STTI's International Nursing Research Congress if selected
- Supporting documentation as evidence of nominee's contribution as outlined in the five criteria above (not to exceed seven pages)
